

Pursuing the ECON track?

Keep this information in mind when choosing classes

200-level and 300-level courses

- All 200- and 300-level ECON courses require ECON 101
- About half of those require ECON 112 and MATH 111/119

400-level courses

- All 400-level courses require ECON 101 and some combination of ECON 112, 201, and 212.
- Most 400-level courses require ECON 201.

About ECON 220

- A portion of 400-level courses require ECON 220: Introduction to Statistical Methods
- ECON 220 is similar to QTM 210: Probability & Statistics
- The ECON department does not accept QTM 210 as an equivalent; they do accept MATH 361 as an equivalent
